If this does not answer your question, then please contact your State Association. Certificates of Currency are provided to each State Association who hen send these onto their respective Cubbs or Regions.

If you require a copy of your Certificate of Currency please contact your State Association. ACA Tave met with Bits olicius, additional information to be included in the justimose program. summan; on the ACA website. This information will be updated shortly, in order to sissue the Certificates of Currency prior to the end of the year for 2024 to avoid delays in issuing these certificates over the Christman/New Year period, RIB and ACA agreed to the following timelines and resuests for information:

- 10 November ACA provide registration numbers & interested details to RIB

- 15 December Final date for ACA & States to pay insurance premiums
- 22 December RIB sends Certificates of Currency to ACA & States

#### ACA Marketing and IT Project update

The ACA have completed additional due diligence for the marketing project by requesting two additional quotes to ensure ACA are achieving value for money as well as engaging the expertise required to deliver this very exciting and important project for the sport.

ACA have now short listed two preferred companies that will provide the value, experience. approach and capability required to deliver the project scope and outcomes. An ACA Board member has been invited to assist in conducting final interviews with both companies to select the company that the ACA feel will successfully deliver this project.

The National member database project has been a priority project for the ACA for the past 12-18 months, Again, additional due diligence has been completed by liaising with other providers and sports to ensure that ACA is aligning with a provider and platform that will provide a fit for purpose database solution that is scalable and can deliver the requirements for the ACA, State Associations, Clubs and Members, The ACA have now appointed an IT Advisor to assist in identifying the best provider that can satisfy the ACA requirements of this project. #### Sport Integrity Australia

Sport Integrity Australia (SIA) was established by the Federal Government in 2020 as the single agency for dealing with existing and emerging integrity related issues in sport, to protect Australian Sport, mitigate integrity threats and provide a safe, fair, and trustworthy environment for all Participants at all levels of sport across Australia. ACA adopted the National Integrity Framework (NIF) in June 2022 which is a set of rules and policies that all members of a sport need to follow when it comes to their behaviour and conduct in sport. In January 2023, the ACA met with the Heads of State and there was a view that the onboarding and education process surrounding ACA's adoption of the NIF may not have been as comprehensive as it needed to be, and that further training was required. ACA have been in contact with SIA, and they are currently performing a review of the NIF in order to strengthen the system. ACA have made a request to SIA that once the review has been completed, the ACA would like to engage SIA to deliver a broader education program in conjunction with our State Associations.
