Ricochet Q & A



There is some confusion about a Dead Ball.

What is a Dead Ball? See Rule 11

A ball already roqueted in a turn, the ball becomes live again when a Hoop is made, or a Bisque taken, or a new turn started.

Dead Balls

Q 1: Can a roquet be claimed on a dead ball?

Q 2; After making a roquet the strikers ball comes to rest very close to a dead ball-(not the one just roqueted)

What happens if in the next stroke a hit is made on the dead ball?

Q 3; After the first continuation shot the striker's ball comes to rest less than 2cm from a dead ball (the one roqueted in the previous stroke)

Can a saving shot be played on the dead ball?

Q 4; After the first continuation shot my strikers ball came to rest in contact with a dead ball.

Can a croquet type shot be played?

What happens if either ball goes over the boundary?

Q 5; Red ball roquets Black ball. With Reds first continuation shot to get a position on Blue the Red touches Black.

Is this the end of Reds turn?

Answers

A 1. No

A 2. It will not be a roquet. There is no penalty unless a fault is committed. Rule (11.2)

A 3. Yes(Rule 11.2)

A 4. Yes, a croquet type shot can be made.eg. roll, split, stop, shot etc. Turn will end unless in the same stroke a roquet is made on a live ball- or a hoop made. (Rule 6.4.6)

A 5. No Red still has the 1continuation shot to make a roquet or hoop (Rule 8.2)
